New Hope Community routinely partners with this local Woodbourne organization. Over the course of the campaign, New Hope Community employees fulfilled the wish lists of 60 children between the ages of six months and two years old. Gifts, including clothing and toys, were then wrapped and delivered by Santa Claus to the children in their classrooms.

Dinner was held on December 12th, providing 580 complete meals to those in need. The event, which operated as a drive-thru meal service and festive holiday celebration, allowed families to pick up free dinners, along with grocery gift cards.
